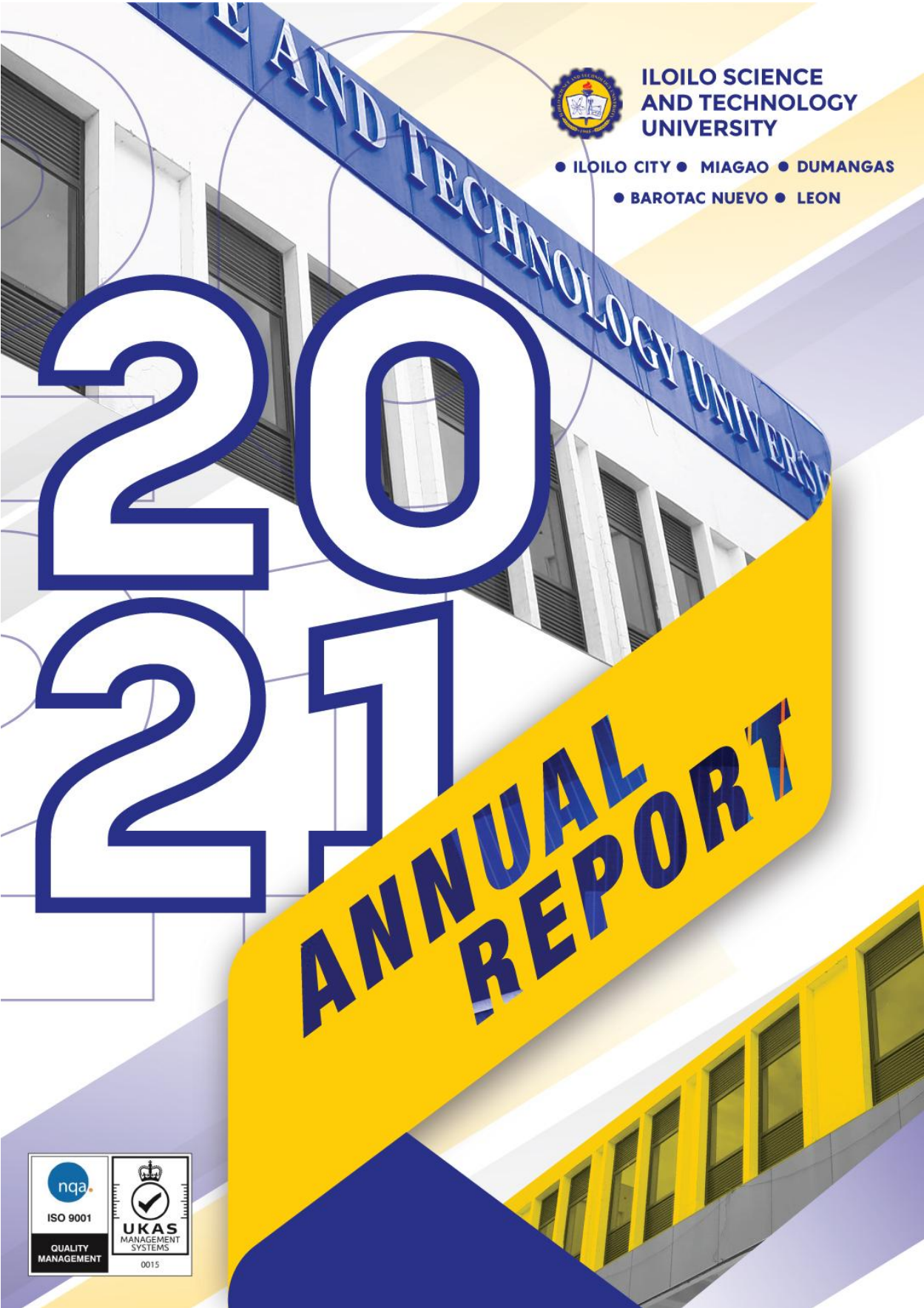

Three out of four programs have an overall performance which is above the national passing percentage. These are the BSED and BEED LET of Iloilo City Campus with 67.9% and 100% overall performance respectively, and BSED LET of Mlagao Campus with 71.43%.

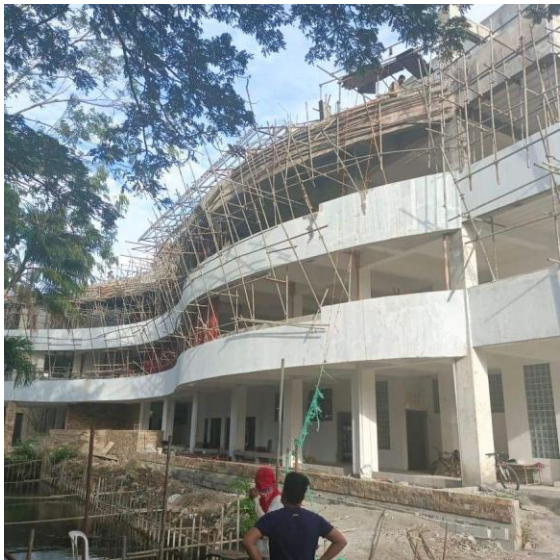
